SUBJECT: Application for Correction of Military Records

Requested Action and Basis for Request. Restore 21 days lost at FY96 year-end balancing. Applicant states he lost these days due to duty commitments and TDYs.

Facts and Discussion. Applicant had 60 days on 1 Oct 95, accrued 30 days, and used 9 days. 60 + 30 = 90 - 9 = 81. He lost 21 days because members cannot carry over more than 60 days into the next FY (10 U.S.C. 701(b)). Applicant states that during assignment to Malaysia daily duty commitments as well as TDY requirements affected his ability to take leave between 1 Oct 95 and 12 Sep 96. Applicant returned from Malaysia on 12 Sep 96 and reported to Kelly AFB TX on 24 Sep 96 and was able to take 9 days leave 15-23 Sep 96. In this case, we support granting relief because applicant was unable to take leave due to military requirements.

Recommendation. Approve restoring 21 days to current leave account.
