SUBJECT: Application for Correction of Military Records -

Requested Action and Basis for Request: Reimbursement of per diem expenses incident to out-processing requirements at from 0800 hours on 23 June through 0800 on 24 June 1997.

Facts: Member and family were required to travel from to complete out-processing actions enroute to their new assignment to His spouse was required to travel with the member so she could sign for her passports: the member was not permitted to sign for these passports.

Discussion: The member's original PCS order was amended on 30 Sep 97 (after his arrival at Lajes) directing member and family to report to for completion of outprocessing requirements. The member's servicing finance office at a suggested he submit a BCMR application to resolve this issue:
