SUBJECT: Application for Correction of Military Records (DD Form 149)

1. <u>REQUESTED ACTION</u>. Applicant requests **award** of the Air Force Good Conduct Medal.

2. <u>BASIS FOR REQUEST</u>. Applicant served three years on Active Duty, honorably.

3. <u>FACTS</u>. Applicant served on Active Duty 7 Feb 92-8 Feb 95; three years and two days. He earned the Air Force Training Ribbon, National Defense Service Medal, and Air Force Outstanding Unit Award. He was awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal for the period 14 Sep 92-8 Feb 95; however, the orders were not cut until after his discharge, and the **decoration** does not appear on his DD Form 214. There is no derogatory information regarding the applicant in the documents provided for review.

4. <u>DISCUSSION</u>. The applicant served the required three years on Active Duty, and received the Air Force Commendation Medal for the majority of that **period**. In the absence of **any** derogatory information, we **can find** no objections to his being awarded the Air Force Good Conduct Medal.

5. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>.

We recommend approval of the applicant's request to be **awarded** the **Air** Force Good Conduct Medal.
