Applicant requests his 8 May 1956 undesirable discharge be upgraded to honorable. Applicant's submission is at Exhibit A.

Applicant's military personnel records were destroyed by fire in 1973. Therefore, the facts surrounding his separation from the Air Force cannot be verified. In attempting to reconstruct the record, a 4 May 1956 order directing applicant's undesirable discharge was the only document located (Exhibit B).

After careful consideration of applicant's request, we found insufficient relevant evidence has been presented to demonstrate the existence of probable error or injustice. Based upon the presumption of regularity in the conduct of governmental affairs and without evidence to the contrary, we must assume that the applicant's discharge was propel- and in compliance with appropriate directives. Therefore, we find no basis upon which to favorably consider this application.

Accordingly, applicant's request is denied.

The Board staff is directed to inform applicant of this decision. Applicant should also be informed that this decision is final and will only be reconsidered upon the presentation of new relevant evidence which was not reasonably available at the time the application was filed.
