SUBJECT: Application for Correction of Military Record - [REDACTED]

The applicant requests a constructive reenlistment to permit retirement the first day of the month following High Year of Tenure (HYT). He filed a timely request within three years of discovering the alleged injustice.

Title 10, USC 509 restricts an airman from extending any one enlistment in excess of 48 months. The applicant extended his 17 Jan 89 (six-year) enlistment a total of 44 months. He needs an additional five months to retire effective 1 Feb 99. We give this date since it is the first day of the month following the applicant's HYT month of Jan 99.

We recommend the applicant be given relief by granting him a two-year, 1 Feb 97 constructive reenlistment. This would establish his date of separation as 31 Jan 99 and permit retirement effective 1 Feb 99.
