<u>Reauested Correction</u>: The applicant, former spouse of the above-named retired member, is requesting corrective action that would entitle her to a Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) annuity.

<u>Basis for Request</u>: The applicant claims her former spouse continued to make SBP premium payments after their divorce and meant for her to have SBP, and the retiree thought the divorce decree was the only documentation necessary.

<u>Backaround</u>: A spouse's eligibility to receive an annuity terminates upon divorce. However, the law provides two mechanisms for changing spouse to former spouse coverage. Both must be exercised within the first year following divorce: the retiree may file an election change, or the former spouse may request the retiree be deemed to have made such a change on his or her behalf. In the latter case, the former spouse must provide legal documentation that the member agreed, or the court ordered the member, to establish former spouse coverage. If neither the member nor the former spouse requests the election change within the one-year eligibility period, former spouse coverage may not be established thereafter.

<u>Facts</u>: The decedent elected spouse coverage based on full retired pay prior to his retirement on 21 Oct 86. Although their **13** Apr 94 divorce terminated the applicant's eligibility as the spouse beneficiary, the member did not request her coverage be canceled and the SBP premiums continued to be deducted from his retired pay until his **31** Jul 98 death.

Discussion: Although the decedent made no election change during the required one-year time limit following divorce, there is no evidence that he requested coverage for his former spouse be terminated, indicative of his intent to maintain her as the eligible SBP beneficiary as required by the court order. To deny this request would be to deny the applicant an asset awarded her by the court.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Although there is no evidence of Air Force error, to preclude a possible injustice, we recommend that the member's record be corrected to reflect that on 14 Apr 94, he elected to change SBP spouse to former spouse coverage, naming the spouse to former spouse beneficiary. Approval should be contingent upon recoupment of appropriate premiums.
