SUBJECT: Application for Correction of Military Received

Requested Action and Basis for Request. Restore 11 days leave lost at FY97 year-end. Applicant states military operational requirements prevented him from using these days.

Facts and Discussion. On 14 Apr 97, the AFBCMR approved restoring 14 days and finance corrected the leave balance in Jul 97. Applicant's commander states that applicant was unable to use all of the restored days due to military requirements. He had 71 days on 30 Sep 9 and lost 11 days on 1 Oct 97 because under 10 USC 701 members cannot carry over more than 60 days into the next FY. In this case, we support granting relief because military necessity precluded applicant from taking leave.

Recommendation. Approve restorin 11 days to FY99 leave account.
