Requested Action and Basis for Request. Restore 12 days lost at FY98 year-end balancing. Applicant states mission requirements prevented him **ficm** using these days.

Facts and Discussion. Applicant had 60 days on 1 Oct 97, used 18 day, and had 72 days on 30 Sep 98. He lost 12 days on 1 Oct 98 because under 10 USC 701 members cannot carry more than 60 days into the next FY. The applicant states he lost 12 days because deployment to from 2 Sep to 4 Oct 98 prevented **him from** using these days before 1 Oct. Applicant's commander supports restoring lost leave since applicant was notified on or about 28 Aug 98 to deploy to FB In this case, we support granting relief because applicant was unable to take leave due to military requirements.

Recommendation. Approve restoring 12 days to current leave account.
