## AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

CASE NUMBER

FD-2003-00354

**GENERAL:** The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

FINDINGS: Upgrade of Discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change of discharge.

ISSUE: Applicant contends discharge was inequitable because it was too harsh and feels that her contributions to the military and others outweighed her mistakes and errors in judgment. The records indicated the applicant received an Article 15 for failing to maintain her dormitory room free of dirt, dust and clutter. She also received three Letters of Reprimand for failing her room inspection and having an unauthorized guest stay in the room and for being late for work and lying about it. In addition, she received a Letter of Counseling and a Record of Individual Counseling for taking excessive breaks during the duty day and for failure to go. The majority of the DRB concluded that through these administrative actions, the applicant had ample opportunities to change her negative behavior. The Board concluded the misconduct was a significant departure from conduct expected of all military members. The characterization of the discharge received by the applicant was found to be appropriate.

**CONCLUSIONS:** The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.

SUBJECT: Letter of Notification

1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for Misconduct--Minor Disciplinary Infractions. The authority for this action is AFPD 36-32 and AFI 36-3208, paragraph 5.49. If my recommendation is approved, your service will be characterized as honorable or general. I am recommending that your service be characterized as general.

## 2. My reasons for this action are:

- a. On or about 20 May 1995 you failed to maintain your dormitory room free of dirt, dust and clutter. For this incident you received nonjudicial punishment consisting of reduction to the grade of Airman effective 16 June 1995 and restriction to Offutt AFB for 14 days. (Atch 1-1)
- b. On or about 18 May 1995 you failed to attend a mandatory sexual harassment briefing. For this incident you received a letter of counseling, dated 18 May 1995. (Atch 1-2)
- c. On or about 15 May 1995 you went on break at 1930 hrs and you didn't return until 1950 hrs. You then went to lunch from 2000 hrs until 2030 hrs. You remained in the breakroom and the hardware maintenance shop failing to return to your duty station until 2200. For these incidents you received a letter of counseling, dated 16 May 1995. (Atch 1-3)
- d. On or about 15 May 1995 you failed to report to your duty section on time. You also lied to your supervisor about your wereabouts. For these two incidents you received a letter of reprimand, dated 15 May 1995. (Atch 1-4)
- e. On or about 13 December 1994 you failed to maintain the cleanliness of your bathroom. For this incident you received a letter of reprimand, dated 13 December 1994. (Atch 1-5)
- f. On or about 12 November 1993 you failed a mandatory dormitory room inspection. It was also discovered that you violated Offutt AFB Regulation 90-1, by having an individual to stay overnight. For these two incidents you received a letter of reprimand, dated 15 November 1993. (Atch 1-6)

Copies of the documents to be forwarded to the separation authority in support of this recommendation are attached. The commander exercising special court-martial jurisdiction or a higher authority will decide whether you will be discharged or retained in the Air Force. If you are discharged, you will be ineligible for reenlistment in the Air Force and probably any other branch of the military.

- 3. You have the right to consult counsel. Military legal counsel has been obtained to assist you. I have made an appointment for you to consult Area Defense Counsel, Area Defense Counsel, Bldg 323C, RM 302, Phone 4-3939, at 1500 hrs on 11 JOLY 1995. Instead of the appointed counsel, you may have another, if the lawyer you request is in the active military service and is reasonably available as determined according to AFI 51-201. In addition to military counsel, you have the right to employ civilian counsel. The Air Force does not pay expenses incident to the employment of civilian counsel. Civilian counsel, if employed, must be readily available.
- 4. You have the right to submit statements in your own behalf. Any statements you want the separation authority to consider must reach me by 6 3011 at 1600 inless you request and receive an extension for good cause shown. I will send them to the separation authority.
- 5. If you fail to consult counsel or to submit statements in your own behalf, your failure will constitute a waiver of your right to do so.
- 6. You have been scheduled for a medical examination. You must report to the 55th Medical Group, Physical Exam Section at 0700 hrs/Part I and 1515 hrs/Part II on 6 July 1995 for the examination.
- 7. Any personal information you furnish in rebuttal is covered by the Privacy Act Statement as explained in AFI 36-3208, attachment 2. A copy of AFI 36-3208 is available for your use in the unit orderly room.
