AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

FD-2003-00437

GENERAL: The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

FINDINGS: The Board grants the requested relief.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by applicant substantiates an impropriety that would justify a change of discharge. However, based upon the record and evidence provided by applicant, the Board finds the applicant's discharge inequitable.

ISSUE:

Applicant contends his discharge was inequitable because it was too harsh. The records indicated the applicant received a general discharge for homosexuality. Member states his discharge did not take into account the good things he did while in the service. The DRB took note of the applicant's duty performance as documented by his performance reports, letters of recommendation and other accomplishments. However, based on today's standards an investigation would not have been held. The Board concluded the discharge was too harsh and should be upgraded to honorable.

CONCLUSIONS: The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

However, in view of the foregoing findings, the Board further concludes that the overall quality of applicant's service is more accurately reflected by an Honorable discharge. The applicant's characterization will remain the same.

- 1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for homosexuality, according to AFR 39-10, under provisions of paragraph 5-35. Copies of the documents to be forwarded to the separation authority to support this recommendation are attached.
- My reasons for this action are:
- a. Your engaging in homosexual acts on diverse occasions between on or about 23 Jun 89 to on or about 18 Jan 91 at or near Grand Forks, ND, as evidenced by statement of dated 7 Feb 91, statement of dated 7 Feb 91, statement of dated l Mar 91. dated 1 Mar 91, statement of statement of dated 18 Apr 91, and a copy of letter from dated 16 Feb 91.
- b. Your statement to an AFOSI Special Agent on or about 18 Apr 91 that you are a homosexual, as evidenced by statement of 🗨 Apr 91 and a copy of letter from dated 16 Feb 91.
- This action could result in your separation with a discharge characterized as honorable or general. I am recommending that you receive a general discharge. The commander exercising SPCM jurisdiction or a higher authority will make the final decision in this matter. If you are discharged, you will be ineligible for reenlistment in the Air Force.
- 4. You have the right to:
 - a. Consult legal counsel.
 - b. Present your case to an administrative discharge board.
 - c. Be represented by legal counsel at a board hearing.
- d. Submit statements in your own behalf in addition to, or in lieu of, the board hearing.
- e. Waive the above rights. You must consult legal counsel before making a decision to waive any of your rights.
- You have been scheduled for a medical examination. You must report to 842 STRAT HOSP at __0700 __hrs on _/O MAY 199/ .

- 6. Military legal counsel, Capt has been obtained to assist you. An appointment has been scheduled for you to consult her on 8 May 91 at 1430 hours in Bldg 230. Instead of the appointed counsel, you may have another, if the lawyer you request is in the active military service and is reasonably available as determined according to AFR 111-1. In addition to military counsel, you have the right to employ civilian counsel. The Air Force does not pay expenses incident to the employment of civilian counsel. Civilian counsel, if employed, must be readily available.
- 7. Confer with your counsel and reply, in writing, within 7 workdays, specifying the rights you choose to exercise. The statement must be signed in the presence of your counsel who also will sign it. If you waive your right to a hearing before an administrative discharge board, you may submit written statements in your own behalf. I will send the statements to the discharge authority with the case file to be considered with this recommendation. If you fail to respond, your failure will constitute a waiver of the right to the board hearing.
- 8. Any personal information you furnish in rebuttal is covered by the Privacy Act Statement as explained in AFR 39-10, attachment 6. A copy of AFR 39-10 is available for your use in your Squadron Orderly Room.
