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AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

GENERAL: The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

FINDINGS: Upgrade of discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change of discharge.

Issues. Applicant was discharged for a pattern of misconduct. The records indicated the applicant received an Article 15, a vacation of suspended punishment, two Letters of Reprimand, and a Letter of Counseling for misconduct. His offenses all concerned being late for work or failure to go. Applicant now contends he was distracted by personal problems such as his mother-in-law's heart attack, being geographically separated from his wife and daughter, and a potential divorce. Applicant states his First Sergeant sent him to see a doctor who prescribed a medication for depression. Unfortunately, applicant's medical records were unavailable to the DRB for review. While the Board notes it is understandable that a member experiencing personal problems has additional stress, the applicant has not shown how his problems were unique. Additionally, the Board concludes there is insufficient evidence to evaluate the merits of applicant's alleged mitigating factors. After examining the records, the DRB concluded the misconduct was a significant departure from conduct expected of all military members and that the discharge was procedurally proper and equitable. Thus no change is warranted; the characterization of the discharge received by the applicant was found to be appropriate.

CONCLUSIONS: The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the Board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.

SUBJECT: Notification Memorandum

1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for a Pattern of Misconduct, specifically, Conduct Prejudicial to Good Order and Discipline. The authority for this action is AFPD 36-32 and AFI 36-3208, paragraph 5.50. If my recommendation is approved, your service can be characterized as honorable or general. I am recommending your service be characterized as general.

2. My reasons for this action are:

a. On or about 29 Jul 02, you failed to go at the time prescribed to your place of duty. As a result, you received an Article 15 vacation action on 14 Aug 02. (Tab 1, Atch 1).

b. On or about 1 Jul 02, you failed to go at the time prescribed to your place of duty. As a result, you received a Letter of Reprimand (LOR) on 2 Jul 02. (Tab 1, Atch 2).

c. On or about 27 Apr 02, you failed to go at the time prescribed to your place of duty. As a result, you received an LOR on 2 May 02. (Tab 1, Atch 3).

d. On or about 7 Mar 02, you failed to go at the time prescribed to your place of duty. As a result, you received an Article 15, UCMJ, on 19 Mar 02. (Tab 1, Atch 4).

e. On or about 14 Dec 01, you failed to go at the time prescribed to your place of duty. As a result, you received a Letter of Counseling (LOC) on 11 Dec 01. (Tab 1, Atch 5).

3. Copies of the documents to be forwarded to the separation authority in support of this recommendation are attached. The commander exercising Special Court Martial Jurisdiction will decide whether you will be discharged or retained in the Air Force. If you are discharged, he will also determine how your service will be characterized. If discharged, you will be ineligible for reenlistment in the Air Force, and any special pay, bonus, or education assistance funds may be subject to recoupment.

4. You have the right to consult counsel. Military legal counsel has been obtained to assist you. I made an appointment for you to consult with the Area Defense Counsel on 03 OCT 02 at 1430 hours in building 512. The telephone number is 828-2675. You may consult civilian counsel at your own expense.

5. You have the right to submit statements on your own behalf. Any statements you want the separation authority to consider must reach me within three workdays of the date of this

memorandum unless you request and receive an extension for good cause. I will forward them to the separation authority.

6. If you fail to consult counsel or to submit statements in your own behalf, your failure will constitute a waiver of your right to do so.

7. You have been scheduled for a medical examination. You must report to the Physical Examination Section at the hospital on Mountain Home AFB. Your scheduled medical examination is on O4OCTOA/O800 Ats at $O800^{HeS}$ hours. You must be in uniform. If you wear glasses, wear them to the scheduled examination.

8. Any personal information you furnish in rebuttal is covered by the Privacy Act of 1974. A copy of AFI 36-3208 is available at the Area Defense Counsel's office or your squadron orderly room.

9. You will surrender your ID card to me immediately. Proceed with a copy of this letter to the Military Personnel Flight (MPF), Customer Service, Building 512, Mountain Home AFB no later than O3 OCT O2 / 1400 HR5 where you will be issued a temporary ID card valid for 90 days. If the discharge action is still pending at the end of 90 days, another temporary ID card will be issued to you until the case is finalized.

10. A copy of this letter also authorizes you to proceed to the Security Forces, Pass and Registration Section, Building 7001, Visitor Control Center, no later than O3OCTO2/1600 HRS where you will turn in your Mountain Home AFB vehicle sticker and your DoD vehicle decal. They will issue a temporary permit good for 90 days. If the discharge action is still pending at the end of 90 days, another temporary vehicle permit will be issued to you until the case is finalized.

11. Finally, proceed with a copy of this letter to the Traffic Management Office (TMO), in Building 512, immediately after receiving your separation orders from the Separations Section at the MPF for arranging shipment of your household goods.
