# AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

FD-2004-00220

**GENERAL:** The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

FINDINGS: Upgrade of discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change of discharge.

**ISSUE:** Applicant was discharged for misconduct. Although member's discharge processing files and medical records were unavailable to the Board for review due to being missing from the record, the Board was aware that member had three Articles 15. One was for underage drinking at San Antonio, TX while assigned to Brooks AFB, one was for drunk driving while assigned to Aviano AB, Italy, and the third was for failure to go, also while assigned to Aviano AB. Because member's discharge file was unavailable to the Board for review, the Board was unable to determine if any additional misconduct on member's part formed part of the basis for the discharge. The Board also could not determine if member consulted counsel or submitted statements on his own behalf at the time of the discharge. When requested to provide any pertinent information he may have about the discharge file or his record of service, applicant failed to respond. Applicant noted while in the service he was young and immature and being assigned overseas contributed to him acting out in a disruptive way. The Board noted applicant was over the age of 19 when discharged, essentially the same age as other airman on their first enlistments who properly adhere to standards and complete their service without a record of misconduct. Applicant failed to provide any documented evidence to substantiate his contentions, and lacking such evidence to the contrary, the Board relies on the presumption of regularity and finds the discharge proper and without basis for an upgrade. No inequity or impropriety could be found in the records available for review.

**CONCLUSIONS:** The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the Board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.
