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# AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

**GENERAL:** The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable, to change the reason and authority for the discharge, and to change the reenlistment code.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

FINDINGS: Upgrade of discharge, change of reason and authority for discharge, and change of reenlistment code are denied.

ISSUE: Applicant contends discharge was inequitable because it was too harsh and was based on the actions of his dependent spouse at the time. The records indicated the applicant received two Article 15s, three Letters of Counseling, and a Vacation action under the UCMJ for various acts of misconduct, including assault. The DRB opined that through these administrative actions, the applicant had ample opportunities to change his negative behavior. The Board concluded the misconduct was a significant departure from conduct expected of all military members. The characterization of the discharge received by the applicant was found to be appropriate.

**CONCLUSIONS:** The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the Board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.

- 1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for minor disciplinary infractions. The authority for this action is AFPD 36-32 and AFI 36-3208, under the provisions of paragraph 5.49. If my recommendation is approved, your service will be characterized as honorable or general. I am recommending that your service be characterized as general.
- 2. My reasons for this action are:
- a. On or about 23 Aug 94, you were late to work, as evidenced by a Letter of Counseling (LOC), dtd 23 Aug 94.
- b. On or about 2 Dec 94, you were late to work, as evidenced by a Letter of Admonition (LOA), dtd 2 Dec 94
- c. On or about 28 Feb 95, you assaulted by pushing her. On or about 6 Mar 95, you did, without authority, fail to go at the time prescribed to your appointed place of duty. On or about 7 Mar 95, you assaulted by striking at her with your hand. On or about 7 Mar 95, you did. without authority, fail to go at the time prescribed to your appointed place of duty. On or about 7 Mar 95, you disobeyed a lawful order, given by a noncommissioned officer. These acts are evidenced by an Article 15, dtd 24 Mar 95.
- d. On or about 6 Apr 95, you reported for duty 10 minutes late, as evidenced by a LOA, dtd 6 Apr 95.
- e. On or about 18 Mar 95, you assaulted by poking and grabbing her, as evidenced by a Record of Proceedings of Vacation of Suspended Nonjudicial Punishment, dtd 7 Apr 95.
- f. On or about 12 Apr 95, you did, without authority, fail to go at the time prescribed to your appointed place of duty, as evidenced by an Article 15, dtd 28 Apr 95.
- 3. Copies of the documents to be forwarded to the separation authority in support of this recommendation are attached. The commander exercising SPCM jurisdiction or a higher authority will decide whether you are discharged or retained in the Air Force, and if you are discharged, how your service will be characterized. If you are discharged, you will be ineligible

for reenlistment in the Air Force and any special pay, bonus, or education assistance funds may be subject to recoupment.

- 4. You have the right to consult legal counsel. Military legal counsel has been obtained to assist you. I have made an appointment for you to consult an at Bldg 6-920, rm 330 on 15 Mag at 1000. You may consult civilian counsel at your own expense.
- 5. You have the right to submit statements in your own behalf. Any statements you want the separation authority to consider must reach me by 17 Mag unless you request and receive an extension for good cause shown. I will send them to the separation authority.
- 6. If you fail to consult counsel or to submit statements in your own behalf, your failure will constitute a waiver of your right to do so.
- 7. You have been scheduled for a medical examination. You must report to the 3rd Aerospace Medicine Squadron, Building 24-850 at 0715 on 16 Mag with your medical records. Fast (drink water only) for 14 hours prior, no alcohol 72 hours prior, no tobacco products 6 hours prior to examination, bring eyeglasses and contact solution if using contacts, and you must be in uniform for the examination.
- 8. Any personal information you furnish in rebuttal is covered by the Privacy Act of 1974. A copy of AFI 36-3208 is available for your use at your Squadron Orderly Room.
- 9. The discharge authority will make the finding and recommendations required under 10 U.S.C 2005(g).
