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# AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

FD-2004-00321

**GENERAL:** The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

**FINDINGS**: Upgrade of discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change of discharge.


**ISSUE**: Applicant contends discharge was inequitable because it was too harsh. The records indicated the applicant received two Article 15s and two Letters of Reprimand for various acts of misconduct. The DRB opined that through these administrative actions, the applicant had ample opportunities to change his negative behavior. The Board concluded the misconduct was a significant departure from conduct expected of all military members. The characterization of the discharge received by the applicant was found to be appropriate.

**CONCLUSIONS:** The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the Board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.

- 1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for minor disciplinary infractions. The authority for this action is AFR 39-10, paragraph 5-46. If my recommendation is approved, your service will be characterized as honorable or general. I am recommending that your service be characterized as general.
- 2. My reasons for this action are:
- a. On or about 21 Jul 92 to on or about 24 Jul 92, you willfully failed to report the Frontier Park Parking Lot Control Center, as it was your duty to do. AF Form 3070 w/atch, 19 Aug 92
- b. On or about 25 Jan 92, you were involved in an altercation that led to physical violence with a previously encountered before with similar results. AF Form 1058 w/atch, 3 Apr 92
- c. On or about 3 Nov 91, you did at F.E. Warren AFR, Wyoming, unlawfully in the lip with a chair. AF Form 3070 w/atchs, 25 Nov 91 strike $\P$

Copies of the documents to be forwarded to the separation authority in support of this recommendation are attached.
