## AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

FD-2004-00461

**GENERAL:** The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

**FINDINGS**: Upgrade of discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change of discharge.

**ISSUE**: Applicant does not contest his discharge. He states that he would like an upgrade so that he can start a career and give his wife and sons the life that they deserve. The records indicated the applicant received two Letters of Reprimand, one Letter of Counseling and four Records of Individual Counseling for various acts of misconduct including dereliction of duty, repeated lateness, failure to carry out instructions, failure to clean his dormitory bathroom, financial irresponsibility, underage drinking, missed medical appointment, exposing his wife to severe cold weather by bringing her to work and having her sit in the car, and for indecent acts with another airman. The DRB opined that through these administrative actions, the applicant had ample opportunities to change his negative behavior. The Board concluded the misconduct was a significant departure from conduct expected of all military members. The characterization of the discharge received by the applicant was found to be appropriate.

**CONCLUSIONS:** The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the Board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.

1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for a Pattern of Misconduct in accordance with AFR 39-10, under the provisions of paragraph 5-47a. I recommend your service be characterized with a General discharge. Copies of the documents to be forwarded to the separation authority to support this recommendation are attached.

2. My reason for this action is:

a. On or about 25 June 1992 you were failed to show to duty at the required time. For this incident, you received a Record of Individual Counseling dated 25 June 1992.

b. Between on or about 27 and 31 July 1992 you failed to show for duty at the required time. For this incident, you received a Record of Individual Counseling dated 4 August 1992.

c. On or about 18 August 1992 you were directed to obtain a haircut prior to the next duty day, you did not do so. For this incident, you received a Record of Individual Counseling dated 20 August 1992.

d. Between on or about 16 March 1993 you were charged with indecent acts with another, statements also imply you were also drinking while under the age of 21. On or about 24 March 1993 your supervisor was noticed that you missed a medical appointment. On or about 26 March 1993 the First Sergeant received notice your club bill was 60 days delinquent. For these incidents, you received a Letter of Reprimand dated 1 April 1993 which resulted in an Unfavorable Information File.

e. On or about 23 September 1993 the First Sergeant received a complaint regarding your repeated failure to do your share of the cleaning in the common bathroom between your domnitory rooms. For this incident, you received a Letter of Counseling dated 23 September 1993.

f. On or about 2 December 1993 Capt was informed you had been bringing your pregnant wife to your Weapon Storage Area detail and having her sit in the car all day waiting for you. For this incident, you received a Record of Individual Counseling dated 3 December 1993.

g. Between on or about 21 November 1993 and 3 December 1993 you failed to maintain sufficient funds in your account to cover six checks. You also failed to make a \$34.00 payment which was due on 30 November 1993. For this incident you received a Letter of Reprimand dated 3 January 1994.

3. This action could result in your separation with a General discharge. The commander exercising SPCM jurisdiction or a higher authority will make the final decision in this matter. If you are discharged, you will be ineligible for reenlistment in the Air Force.

4. You have the right to consult counsel. Military legal counsel has been obtained to assist you. I have made an appointment for you to consult Capt  $\frac{18 \sqrt{245}}{18}$  at Building 2245 on  $\frac{18 \sqrt{2494}}{18}$  at  $\frac{0930}{18}$  hours. You may consult civilian counsel at your own expense.

5. You have the right to submit statements in your own behalf. Any statements you want the separation authority to consider must reach me by  $// J_{AN} 9/ at /600 \text{ km}$  unless you request and receive an extension for good cause shown. I will send them to the separation authority.

6. If you fail to consult counsel or to submit statements in your own behalf, your failure will constitute a waiver of your right to do so.

7. You are scheduled for a physical examination. You must report to the 92d Medical Group, Physical Exams, Bldg 9010, Room 119 at 0730 hours on 12 1 for the examination. You must be in uniform and have your medical records with you. If you have any questions regarding your appointment, call Physical Exams at Ext-5757.

8. If you need any assistance with moving your household goods, please contact TMO at Ext-5815.

9. Any personal information you furnish in rebuttal is covered by the Privacy Act Statement as explained in AFR 39-10, attachment 2. A copy of AFR 39-10 is available for your use in your unit orderly room.
