### AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

FD-2005-00050

**GENERAL**: The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

**FINDINGS**: Upgrade of discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change of discharge.


ISSUE: Applicant does not contest his discharge. He states that his post-service, i.e. no trouble with the law, married, has a steady job and finished college has improved his life and believes an upgrade to Honorable would help him to further his goal of improvement. The records indicated the applicant received an Article 15 for wrongfully using marijuana. The Board concluded the misconduct was a significant departure from conduct expected of all military members. The characterization of the discharge received by the applicant was found to be appropriate.

**CONCLUSIONS:** The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the Board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.

SUBJECT: Notification Memorandum

1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for Misconduct, specifically, Drug Abuse. The authority for this action is AFPD 36-32 and AFI 36-3208, chapter 5, section H, paragraph 5.54. If my recommendation is approved, your service will be characterized as honorable, general or under other than honorable conditions. I am recommending that your service be characterized as general.

## 2. My reason for this action is:

- a. Between on or about 1 Dec 99 and 28 Jun 99, on divers occasions, you wrongfully used marijuana. For these incidents you received an Article 15 dated 8 Sep 99. Your punishment consisted of reduction to the grade of Airman Basic with a new date of rank of 8 Sep 99, forfeiture of \$479.00 pay per month for two months, restriction to Eglin Air Force Base, Florida for 45 days and 45 days extra duty.
- 3. Copies of the documents to be forwarded to the separation authority in support of this recommendation are attached. The commander exercising SPCM jurisdiction or a higher authority will decide whether you will be discharged or retained in the Air Force and if you are discharged, how your service will be characterized. If you are discharged, you will be ineligible for reenlistment in the Air Force. Special pay, bonuses, or education assistance funds may be subject to recoupment.
- 4. Military legal counsel, Capt Wright-Patterson AFB, OH, DSN 787-7841, has been obtained to assist you, please contact him. Instead of the appointed counsel, you may have another, if the lawyer you request is in the active military service and is reasonably available, as determined according to AFI 51-201. In addition to military counsel, you have the right to employ civilian counsel at your own expense. Civilian counsel, if employed, must be readily available.
- 5. You have the right to submit statements in your own behalf. Any statements you want the separation authority to consider must reach me within 3 workdays from today unless you request and receive an extension for good cause shown. I will send them to the separation authority.

- 6. If you fail to consult counsel or to submit statements on your own behalf, your failure will constitute a waiver of your right to do so.
- 7. You will complete a medical examination with the 96th Medical Group on 21 Oct 99 at 0715 hours.
- 8. You have been scheduled for an appointment with the 96th Mission Support Squadron, separations section, on 20 Oct 99 at 1330 hours. You will need to report to TMO immediately after your separations briefing.
- 9. You are required to receive a briefing from the Family Support Center prior to your separation. You received your Transition Assistance Management Program (TAMP) briefing on 12 Oct 99.
- 10. Any personal information you furnish in rebuttal is covered by the Privacy Act of 1974. A copy of AFI 36-3208 is available for your use in your unit orderly room.
