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AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

FD-2005-00227

GENERAL: The applicant appeals for a change to the reason and authority for the discharge.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

FINDINGS: Change of reason and authority for discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change in the reason and authority for discharge.

ISSUE: Applicant does not contest her discharge. She states that she would like to receive the GI Bill and the reason and authority was holding her back. The records indicated the applicant received an Honorable discharge for Unsatisfactory Performance, specifically for failing her CDC course twice. In addition she also received an Article 15 for writing bad checks and a Letter of Reprimand for repeatedly lying to her supervisor and others about having appointments in order to obtain two days unauthorized absence from duty. The Board concluded the characterization received was found to be appropriate along with the reason and authority for discharge. The applicant cited her desire to receive the G.I. Bill benefits as justification for upgrade. The DRB noted that when the applicant applied for these benefits, she signed a statement (DD Form 2366) that she understood she must receive an Honorable discharge to receive future educational entitlements. Since the applicant did receive an Honorable discharge, the Board encourages the applicant to reapply for her GI Bill benefits and show the VA that her reason and authority for discharge were for failure to pass her CDC.

CONCLUSIONS: The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the Board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.


- 1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for failure to progress in on-the-job training (OJT). The authority for this action is AFPD 36-32 and AFI 36-3208, paragraph 5.26.3. If my recommendation is approved, your service will be characterized as either honorable or general. I am recommending that your service be characterized as honorable.
- 2. My reasons for this action are:
- (a) On 25 Feb 04, you failed to meet the minimum passing score of 65% for the first time on your Career Development Course (CDC) End of Course (EOC) examination by scoring 43% (Attachment 2).
- (b) On 19 May 04, you failed to meet the minimum passing score of 65% for the second time on your Career Development Course (CDC) End of Course (EOC) examination by scoring 61%. The second failure terminated your enrollment in your CDC (Attachment 6).
- 3. Though not used as a basis for your discharge, the following actions will be reviewed by the separation authority:
- (a) Between 9-18 Sep 02, you provided false official statements to your supervisor and other senior noncommissioned officers about having military appointments that interfere with your military duty, to obtain two days unauthorized absence from duty. For your dishonesty and deceit you received a Letter of Reprimand (LOR), dated 19 Sep 02 (Attachment 1).
- (b) Between 10-12 January 2004, you wrote several checks from an account which had insufficient funds. For your misconduct, you received Article 15 punishment, dated 21 Apr 04, consisting of a suspended reduction to airman, suspended forfeiture of \$668.00 pay per month for 2 months, and 30 days extra duty. This Article 15 established an Unfavorable Information File (Attachment 5 & 11).
- (c) On 1 Apr 04, you received an LOR for failing your Career Development Course (CDC) End of Course (EOC) examination. Although the LOR states the action was taken for the second CDC failure, it is obvious due to the date of the LOR the action was taken for the first CDC failure (Attachment 4).

The commander exercising SPCM jurisdiction or a higher authority will decide whether you are discharged or retained in the Air Force, and if you are discharged, how your service will be characterized. If you are discharged, you will be ineligible for reenlistment in the Air Force, and any special pay, bonus, or education assistance funds may be subject to recoupment.
5. You have the right to consult legal counsel. Military legal counsel has been obtained to assist you. I have made an appointment for you to consult \$552-3887, at Bldg 10480, Room 330 on at You may consult civilian counsel at your own expense.
6. You have the right to submit statements in your own behalf. Any statements you want the separation authority to consider must reach me within three duty days after the date of this letter unless you request and receive an extension for good cause shown. I will forward any statements you provide to the separation authority.
7. If you fail to consult counsel or to submit statements in your own behalf, your failure will constitute a waiver of your right to do so.
8. You have been scheduled for medical examinations. You must report, with your medical records, to the 3rd Aerospace Medicine Squadron, Bldg 5595, at <u>0930</u> on <u>29 SEP 04</u> for your first exam, at which time you will be notified of the time for your second exam. Bring with you the Medical Assessment Letter (DD Form 2697). You are to refrain from alcohol for 72 hours, and refrain from the use of tobacco products for 6 hours, prior to examination. Bring eyeglasses (and contact solution if using contacts) if applicable. You must be in uniform for these examinations.
9. You have been scheduled for a Transition Assistance Program briefing. You must report to the Family Support Center at <u>0900</u> on <u>30 Sep of</u> . You have also been scheduled for a TMO Household Goods Shipment preprocessing briefing. You must report to Bldg 8517 People Center), Room 247 at <u>1000</u> on <u>10c7 of</u> . You must be in uniform for all appointments.
