AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

FD-2005-00387

GENERAL: The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to honorable.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

FINDINGS: Upgrade of discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change of discharge.

ISSUE: Applicant received a General discharge for Misconduct – Commission of a Serious Offense

Applicant contends that he would like to finish school and achieve a college degree. Although the Board was sympathetic to the impact the loss of these benefits was having on the applicant, this is not a matter of inequity or impropriety which would warrant an upgrade. The records indicated the applicant received an Article 15 for misconduct to include failure to return to work, absenting himself from his unit without authorization, failure to pay a just debt, and numerous instances of writing bad checks. The DRB opined that through these administrative actions, the applicant had ample opportunities to change his negative behavior. The Board concluded the misconduct was a significant departure from conduct expected of all military members, and the characterization of the discharge received by the applicant was found to be appropriate.

CONCLUSIONS: The Discharge Review Board concludes that the discharge was consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation and was within the discretion of the discharge authority and that the applicant was provided full administrative due process.

In view of the foregoing findings the Board further concludes that there exists no legal or equitable basis for upgrade of discharge, thus the applicant's discharge should not be changed.

SUBJECT: Notification Memorandum

1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for Commision of Serious Offenses. The authority for this action is AFPD 36-32 and AFI 36-3208, paragraph 5.52.3. If my recommendation is approved, your service will be characterized as either honorable or under honorable conditions (general). I am recommending that your service be characterized as under honorable conditions (general).

2. My reasons for this action, as evidenced by the Article 15 dated 12 Apr 99, are as follows:

a. On divers occassions between on or about 15 Jan 99 and on or about 10 Feb 99, you wrote 25 checks to the Howard AFB Enlisted Club for \$100.00 each, and failed to maintain sufficient funds for their payment.

b. Between on or about 13 Jan 99 and on or about 23 Jan 99 you wrote 10 checks to AAFES for \$300.00 each, and failed to maintain sufficient funds for their payment.

c. You were indebted to the Howard AFB Community Bank in the sum of \$7,280.00, which became due and payable between on or about 1 Jan 99 and on or about 24 Feb 99, and you did thereafter dishonorably fail to pay the debt.

d. You had knowledge of a lawful order issued to you by your supervisor to return to duty at 1200 hours on 18 Feb 99, and on or about 18 Feb 99 you failed to obey the same by wrongfully not returning to work and departing the country of Panama.

e. On or about 18 Feb 99, you absented yourself from your unit, 24th Civil Engineering Squadron, and did remain so absent until on or about 23 Feb 99.

3. Copies of the document to be forwarded to the separation authority in support of this recommendation are attached. The commander exercising SPCM jurisdiction or a higher authority will decide whether you will be discharged or retained in the Air Force and, if you are discharged, how your service will be characterized. If you are discharged, you will be ineligible for reenlistment in the Air Force.

4. You have the right to consult counsel. Military counsel has been obtained to assist you. I have made an appointment for you to consult with Captain ADC MacDill AFB, FL on 14 April 1999 at 1400 hours. Captain can be reached at DSN 968-4455/6 (Fax: 4457). You may consult civilian counsel at your own expense.

5. You have the right to submit statements in your own behalf. Any statements you want the separation authority to consider must reach me by 10 Apr 1999 (three workdays) unless you request and receive an extension for good cause shown. I will send them to the separation authority.

6. If you fail to consult counsel or to submit statements in your own behalf, your failure will constitute a waiver of your right to do so.

7. You have been scheduled for a medical examination. You must report to Howard AFB Flight Medicine at Bldg 218, on 15 Apr 1999 at 1300 hours for the examination. You must be in military uniform and have your glasses if you wear them and medical records.

8. Any personal information you furnish in rebuttal is covered by the Privacy Act of 1974. A copy of AFI 36-3208, is available for your use at the Legal Office, Bldg 238, Howard AFB, Panama.

9. Execute the attached acknowledgment and return it to me immediately.
