AIR FORCE DISCHARGE REVIEW BOARD DECISIONAL RATIONALE

FD-2005-00487

GENERAL: The applicant appeals for upgrade of discharge to general.

The applicant was offered a personal appearance before the Discharge Review Board (DRB) but declined to exercise this right.

The attached brief contains available pertinent data on the applicant and the factors leading to the discharge.

FINDINGS: Upgrade of discharge is denied.

The Board finds that neither the evidence of record nor that provided by the applicant substantiates an inequity or impropriety that would justify a change of discharge.

ISSUE:

The applicant did not receive an administrative discharge, thus her contention of inequity is not applicable. The applicant received a Bad Conduct Discharge, a punitive discharge, as part of her sentence resulting from a Special Court Martial conviction. She was found guilty of two offenses. The first was for wrongful use of marijuana on divers occasions and the second offense was for attempt to wrongfully possess Lysergic Acid Diethylamide (LSD). She received Bad Conduct Discharge, reduction to airman and two months confinement. Under the provisions of Section 1553, 10 USC, the only basis for change of a Bad Conduct discharge is clemency. The applicant presented evidence which the DRB opined did not warrant granting clemency.

CONCLUSIONS: The Discharge Review Board concluded that the applicant's punitive discharge by Special Court-Martial is appropriate under the facts and circumstances of this case and there is insufficient basis, as an act of clemency, for change of discharge.

General discharge, than a "Dishonorable" discharge, therefore I feel my discharge is inequitable. In regards to propriety, I was 19 years old when I was being discharged from the military. The process as to which I went through my discharge were strange to say the least. We were rushed through the process and my lawyer, who I only got to sit with the day before the court-martial, didn't do a lot for me. I was also rushed into questioning and pressured into answering questions immediately and without a lawyer present. I was a scared girl and unsure of what to do. I thought that the officers or OSI would take care of me and not let anything happen to me. I tried to cooperate with them, but when I couldn't deliver anyone else for them to prosecute, they threw me to the fishes and sent me to my lawyer with nothing. This I think was wrong of them to do, since we are taught that officers are there to help you and you should always cooperate and help them any way you can.

I, [REDACTED], am writing to request a review and an amendment to my discharge. During my time in service I was considered a "Good" Airman. I arrived to work on time, did as I was told, and even received a couple of Letters of Appreciation from a Lt. Col and a MSgt for hard work. I did have on instance where I received an article 15 for not showing up to work, but I explained the situation to my supervisor, Sgt. [REDACTED] and agreed to take the punishment which I deserved and work and extra shift to make up for missing work. I was never late or missed work again.

In February, when I was arrested by AFOSI, I was really not myself. I had just lost my grandmother after a bout with Cancer and just returned from emergency leave. It was a hard time for me, but this is not an excuse. Simply, an explanation of why I was not thinking clearly. I also feel that the way I was treated during the process of discharge was horrible and that I was not given any information about the process. I hardly had any time with my lawyer before the actual court martial. I tried to cooperate with OSI, but when I couldn't deliver anyone for them, they just dismissed me and didn't even mention how Ai tried to help them. I was a scared girl then and I had no idea what I was really getting into. After the process was over I was never told or explained to what all I could do about appealing my decision. I had never been in that much trouble before, or ever again. I have since proven myself to be an exemplary citizen, having never even received so much as a speeding ticket. I have been blessed with so much love and support from my husband and family.

Since being dismissed from the military I married to a wonderful man who has proven to be an exceptional military member making Technical sergeant earlier than most of his peers and about to test for Master. We have two beautiful daughters, [REDACTED] who are truly the most wonderful children in the world. I have volunteered at Jada's schools and helped out whenever possible. She has done outstanding in her reading and math skills. [REDACTED] is following in her sisters footsteps showing us how smart she is. I continued to do great work, even though moving jobs. I worked at Current Checks, Inc. I was a customer service representative and after having [REDACTED] I quit to stay at home with her. I began working again in 2001 for another company doing customer service again, but felt unfulfilled. I decided to go to a vocational school and learn something that I could make a career out of. So I went to the National Institute of Technology in San Antonio, Texas, and studied Medical Administrative Assistant. I graduated in February 2005 Summa Cum Laude. I began my internship at the Randolph Clinic in San Antonio and learned how to check in patients, code visits and work with doctors. When we moved to Germany I was very excited to have an opportunity to learn another culture and language. Also, to start work doing something meaningful. I got a job working at the Landstuhl Regional Medical Center Pediatric clinic. I have been here since June of 2005 and I love it here. I have gotten nothing but compliments since beginning work here and

I have shown my initiative in taking on new projects, helping run the clinic and setting up and inputting the doctors' schedules. I am one of the two front desk personnel and we are the first and last people who they see and we must make a good impression.

I believe that I have proven to be an excellent citizen and an exemplary employee post-service. And I know that my life shows that I am responsible and that I have a good standing in the community. We have bought and sold a house and have maintained an outstanding credit score. We are responsible and loving parents and our children reflect this. My in service conduct was an abnormality in my behavior and not at all normal to my regular life. I am not malicious in nature and I have demonstrated that I am a good citizen. I am a law abiding citizen who only wants to look ahead and have a loving family and a good career. I have served my time and I believe that I have demonstrated my true character over the years. I am hoping for a change to my discharge so I can have a clean slate and have a new beginning. Thank you for your time.
