- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected by removing the fitness report for 18 June to 25 September 1992, a copy of which is at Tab A to enclosure (1). As indicated in enclosure (2), the Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC) Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB) has directed removal of the contested fitness report. Petitioner further requested removal of his failure of selection before the Fiscal Year (FY) 2003 Lieutenant Colonel Selection Board, so as to be considered by the FY 2004 Lieutenant Colonel Selection Board, scheduled to convene on 9 October 2002, as an officer who has not failed of selection to lieutenant colonel. Finally, he requested remedial consideration for promotion.
- 2. The Board, consisting of Messrs. Agresti, McBride and Shy, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 21 August 2002, and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the limited corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. In correspondence attached as enclosure (3), the HQMC office having cognizance over the subject matter of Petitioner's request to strike his failure of selection for promotion has commented to the effect that this request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (3), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting limited relief, specifically, removal of Petitioner's failure of selection for promotion.

The Board finds Petitioner's request for consideration by a remedial promotion board should be denied. In this regard, they note that the next regular promotion board is scheduled to convene soon, on 9 October 2002. Further, they find that his consideration by a regular promotion board, with a corrected fitness report record and status as not having failed of selection, will provide him adequate relief.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following limited corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

- a. That Petitioner's record be corrected so that he will be considered by the earliest possible selection board convened to consider officers of his category for promotion to lieutenant colonel as an officer who has not failed of selection for promotion to that grade.
- b. That any material or entries inconsistent with or relating to the Board's recommendation be corrected, removed or completely expunged from Petitioner's record and that no such entries or material be added to the record in the future.
- c. That any material directed to be removed from Petitioner's naval record be returned to the Board, together with a copy of this Report of Proceedings, for retention in a confidential file maintained for such purpose, with no cross reference being made a part of Petitioner's naval record.
 - d. That Petitioner's request for remedial consideration for promotion be denied.
- 4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(c)) it is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

- 3. The Commandant of the Marine Corps is not empowered to grant or deny the removal of failure(s) of selection from a Naval record. Accordingly, your case will be forwarded to the Board for Correction of Naval Records (BCNR) for consideration of that issue.

- 1. Recommend approval of Major request for removal of his failure of selection.
- 2. Per the reference, we reviewed cord and petition. Major Spiled selection on the Thus USMC Lieutenant Colonel Selection Board. He successfully petitioned the Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB) to remove the Transfer report from 920618 to 920925. In requests removal of his failure of selection.
- 3. In our opinion, the favorable PERB action does increase the competitiveness of the record. But with the petitioned report removed, Major record still contains considerable competitive jeopardy in the following areas:
- a. Relative Value. Major Relative Values remain below those of his peers being selected for promotion. His Cumulative Relative Values of 80.00, 80.00, 90.61, 90.61, and 95.30 indicate a mid-pack performance and remain a competitive concern.
- b. Reviewing Officer Comparative Assessment. Major
 Reviewing Officer Comparative Assessments remain a competitive concern. On the 990201 to 990719 report
 marked him in the 3 block with zero marked below him and 29 marked above him. On the 990816 to 000731 report,
 marked him in the 4 block with two marked below him and 22 marked above him.
- c. Comments from Col Turner. The comments on Major shirst two reports reviewed by remain competitive concerns.

4. In summary, the favorable PERB action did change the competitiveness cord. Though we recognize his record contains other areas of competitive concern, we believe hould be afforded the benefit of the doubt and recommend approval of his request for removal of his failure of selection.
