- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected by removing the fitness reports for 2 April to 31 July 1997 and 1 August to 10 October 1997, copies of which are at Tabs A and B. As indicated in enclosure (2), the Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC) Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB) has directed removal of the contested fitness reports. Petitioner further requested removal of his failures of selection before the Fiscal Year (FY) 2002 and 2003 Lieutenant Colonel Selection Boards, so as to be considered by the selection board next convened to consider officers of his category for promotion to lieutenant colonel as an officer who has not failed of selection to that grade.
- 2. The Board, consisting of Messrs. Chapman and Kim and Ms. Nofziger, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 31 January 2002, and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. The contested fitness reports were not removed until after both of Petitioner's failures of selection to lieutenant colonel.

c. In correspondence attached as enclosure (3), the HQMC Officer Assignment Branch, Personnel Management Division (MMOA-4) has commented to the effect that Petitioner's request to remove his FY 2002 failure of selection has merit and warrants favorable action. They did not address his FY 2003 failure of selection, as it occurred after their opinion had been submitted.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the requested relief. They find the MMOA-4 advisory opinion applicable as a basis for removing both failures of selection, as the contested fitness reports were in Petitioner's record for both selection boards, and the FY 2003 board considered him as an officer who had previously failed of selection. In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

- a. That Petitioner's record be corrected so that he will be considered by the earliest possible selection board convened to consider officers of his category for promotion to lieutenant colonel as an officer who has not failed of selection for promotion to that grade.
- b. That any material or entries inconsistent with or relating to the Board's recommendation be corrected, removed or completely expunged from Petitioner's record and that no such entries or material be added to the record in the future.
- c. That any material directed to be removed from Petitioner's naval record be returned to the Board, together with a copy of this Report of Proceedings, for retention in a confidential file maintained for such purpose, with no cross reference being made a part of Petitioner's naval record.
- 4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(c)) it is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

In addition, the Automated Fitness Report System (the data base which generates your Master Brief Sheet) will be modified by eliminating any indication of nonconcurence by the Reviewing Officer.
- 3. The Commandant of the Marine Corps is not empowered to grant or deny the removal of failure(s) of selection from a Naval record. Accordingly, your case will be forwarded to the Board for Correction of Naval Records (BCNR) for consideration of that issue.

- 1. Recommend approval of removal of his failure of selection.
- 2. Per the reference, we reviewed and petition. failed selection on the FY02 USMC Lieutenant colonel Promotion Board. Subsequently, he successfully petitioned the Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB) to remove the Reviewing Officers comments on the Annual fitness report of 970402 to 970731 and the Transfer fitness report of 970801 to 971010. Equests removal of his failure of selection.
- 3. The petitioned fitness reports contained competitive concerns that may have resulted in the failure of selection. Removal of these comments increases the competitiveness of the record. Because the Reviewing Officer's comments in the petitioned reports may have resulted in the petitioned reports may failure of selection, we recommend approval of his request for removal of the failure of selection.
