This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of Title 10 of the United States Code section 1552.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 11 June 2003. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies. The Board was unable to obtain your official record, and conducted its review based on the copies of the record that you submitted.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found that the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice.

The Board found that you enlisted in the Marine Corps on 6 June 1966 at age 18. On 6 April 1967 you reported to the Republic of Vietnam for duty. On 2 October 1968 you were awarded nonjudicial punishment (NJP) for failure to go to your appointed place of duty and failure to obey a lawful order to report for mess duty, and were awarded a suspended reduction to paygrade E-3 and a forfeiture of pay. On 2 February 1969 the suspended punishment was vacated based on your failure to obey a lawful order by being in an off limits area of the Republic of Vietnam. On 11 March 1969 you departed the Republic of Vietnam.

On 26 September 1969 you were convicted by civil court of embezzlement because of your failure to return a rental car to its owner and were sentenced to pay the owner \$2500 in monthly
