
This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of title 10 of the United States Code, section 1552.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 21 October 2003. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion furnished by CNO memorandum 5420 N130D/03U0719 dated 10 October 2003, a copy of which is attached.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found that the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the advisory opinion. Accordingly, your application has been denied. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request.

It is regretted that the circumstances of your case are such that favorable action cannot be taken. You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new and material evidence or other matter not previously considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.

1. The following provides comment and recommendation on [REDACTED]'s petition.
2. N130 recommends disapproval of [REDACTED] petition for an Enlistment Bonus (EB) in the amount of \$14,000.
3. [REDACTED] entered the Delayed Entry Program (DEP) on 8 August 2001, volunteered for the Nuclear Field Program, and signed an EB contract in the amount of \$14,000. He shipped to active duty on 12 February 2002. In his petition [REDACTED] requests favorable action that would allow payment of an EB of \$14,000.
4. EB eligible ratings and award levels are announced by OPNAV (GENADMIN) messages. The message in effect the day a member enters the DEP and the day the member ships to active duty, determines the amount of EB a member is eligible to receive. In accordance with BUPERS message 201100Z JUL 01 (message in effect at the time [REDACTED] entered the DEP), a member entering the Nuclear Field program and shipping to active duty between December 2001 and May 2002 is eligible for an EB at the award level of \$12,000. [REDACTED] qualifies for an EB of \$12,000. Please update the member's pay record.
