- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Petitioner applied to this Board requesting her naval record be corrected by changing the reentry code she was assigned on 18 April 1992.
- 2. The Board, consisting of messrs. and injustice on 12 reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 12 The Board, consisting of Messrs. May 2010 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy on 19 April 1988. On 23 October 1991 she passed the HM3 examination but was not advanced. She was honorably released from active duty and transferred to the Navy on 18 April 1992 in pay grade E-3. She was assigned a reentry code of RE-4.
- Individuals serving in pay grade E-3 who failed to meet professional growth criteria for the first enlistment but were eligible in all other respects and recommended for advancement may be assigned a reentry code of RE-3R.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record the Board concludes that Petitioner's request warrants favorable action. The Board concludes that a reentry code of RE-3R should now be assigned since she was recommended for reenlistment and advancement at her discharge as evidenced by her taking a petty officer examination.

RECOMMENDATION:

- a. That Petitioner's naval record be corrected to show that on 18 April 1992, she was assigned a reentry code of RE-3R.
- b. That a copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
