REVIEW OF NAVAL RECORD

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a) Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected to show that he was transferred to the Retired Reserve (Awaiting Pay at Age 60) vice discharged from the United States Marine Corps Reserve in February 2010.
- 2. The Board, consisting of Messrs. Pfeiffer, Zsalman, and George reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 12 October 2010 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. On 8 February 2010, Petitioner had completed 21 years, 0 months and 0 days of qualifying reserve service for non-regular retired pay benefits (at age 60) under 10 USC chapter 1223.

c. At that time, Petitioner was eligible to request transfer to the Retired Reserve (Awaiting Pay at Age 60), however he failed to submit a timely request.

- d. On 8 February 2010, Petitioner was discharged from the United States Marine Corps Reserve due to the expiration of his enlistment contract. He was not affiliated with the Armed Forces after the discharge.
- e. In June 2010, Petitioner submitted an application with this Board seeking to change his record to show that he was transferred to the Retired Reserve (Awaiting Pay at Age 60) vice being discharged.
- f. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

- a. On 1 February 2010, Petitioner was transferred to the Retired Reserve (Awaiting Pay at Age 60) in pay grade E-7 with 20 years, 0 months and 0 days of qualifying non-regular service as computed under 10 USC Chapter 1223. Note: Petitioner was transferred to the Retired Reserve in pay grade E-7 because he did not meet the time-in-grade requirement to be transferred as an E-8.
- b. A copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
- 4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6 (c) it is certified that quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the
